My Beloved in the Lord,

As our Nation, our Holy Orthodox Church, our Metropolis and local Parish Communities, and the world continue to confront the challenging effects of COVID-19, I pray this letter finds you all well and in good health.

During these most difficult times we are called, as Orthodox Christians, to project faith, hope, and courage in the face of the fear and panic pervading society. We cannot ignore the challenges presented by the existence and spread of the Coronavirus. The opposite is more fitting. We must increase our prayers of supplication, our compassion to help one another, and our trust in God who is the Physician of our souls and bodies.
